Workshop Description:

This workshop will explore the basic elements of dance and ways to implement them into daily lessons. Movement, recorder, drama and instrument playing will be woven together to enhance storytelling. In the second part of the workshop participants will learn how to label, store, and move instruments. This hands on experience will leave you with the knowledge of how to replace nails and tubing, fix buzzing resonator boxes, remove rust, and restore your instruments to their original beauty.

Lissa is in her 8th year of “retirement” after a teaching full time for thirty years. Her teaching experience spans preschool the to adults. She is now teaching music to children three to six years old at Mercy Montessori Center. Lissa holds a Bachelor’s Degree from Western Michigan University and a Master’s Degree from Indiana University. She has completed her Orff Certification as well as Master Classes and Orff Curriculum. She attended the summer course at the Orff Institute in Salzburg, Austria. Lissa is a Movement and Recorder Instructor for OS Teacher Training. Lissa has been active member of the Greater Cincinnati American Orff-Schulwerk Chapter since 1987. She is currently one of the Local Conference Chairs for the 2018 AOSA Professional Development Conference in Cincinnati. She has served on the AOSA National Board of Trustees as a Region Representative and member of Technology, Advocacy, and 50th Anniversary Conference Committees. She also served on the Board of Directors for the Cincinnati Children’s Choir and taught Musicianship Through Movement at the CCC Summer Festival for many years. Lissa has presented at several AOSA national conferences and chapter workshops. Serves on the Board of Directors for the American Center for Elemental Music and Movement. Lissa is the Handbell, Youth, and Children’s Music Director at Northminster Presbyterian Church. She is a flute player and she rings handbells in the Cincinnati Collaborative Ringing Project, of which she is a founding member.
